PRIORITY FOR TENANCY

Priority for tenancy will be given to eligible Tsawout First Nation band members.

All applicants must meet BC Housing Indigenous Housing Fund requirements, including applicable household income limits and other program criteria.

TENANCY PROCESS UNDERWAY

Applications will be reviewed, eligibility will be confirmed, and applicants will be contacted regarding the next steps in the tenancy process.



TENTATIVE MOVE-IN DATE
OCTOBER 1, 2026

Subject to construction completion and final occupancy approvals.

WHY ARE PHASE 2 RENTAL RATES DIFFERENT FROM PHASE 1?

- 1 We understand that community members may notice that the rental rates for Phase 2 are significantly lower than those in Phase 1.
- 2 Phase 2 was developed through funding provided by BC Housing's Indigenous Housing Fund, which supports deeply subsidized affordable housing. As a condition of this funding, the Phase 2 units must follow BC Housing program requirements, including established rental rates, maximum household income limits, and eligibility criteria.
- 3 Although Phase 1 and Phase 2 are located within the same development, they are separate housing projects with different funding agreements. Because of these different funding models, the rental rates and eligibility requirements are not the same.
- 4 The lower rental rates in Phase 2 are made possible through BC Housing's subsidy program and are intended to make housing more affordable for eligible households.

Tsawout First Nation and the Tsawout Housing Association appreciate the community's understanding as we administer each housing program according to its funding requirements while continuing to increase safe and affordable housing opportunities for Tsawout members.

PLEASE NOTE: Submitting an application does not guarantee tenancy. All applications will be assessed based on eligibility, program requirements, unit availability, and the tenant selection process.

We look forward to welcoming new residents to Phase 2 and thank all applicants for their interest in becoming part of the Tsawout Multiplex community.

Priority for tenancy will be given to eligible STÁUTW First Nation band members. All applicants must meet the eligibility requirements of the BC Housing Indigenous Housing Fund program, including the applicable household income limits and other program criteria.

The **tentative move-in date is October 1, 2026**, subject to construction completion and final occupancy approvals.

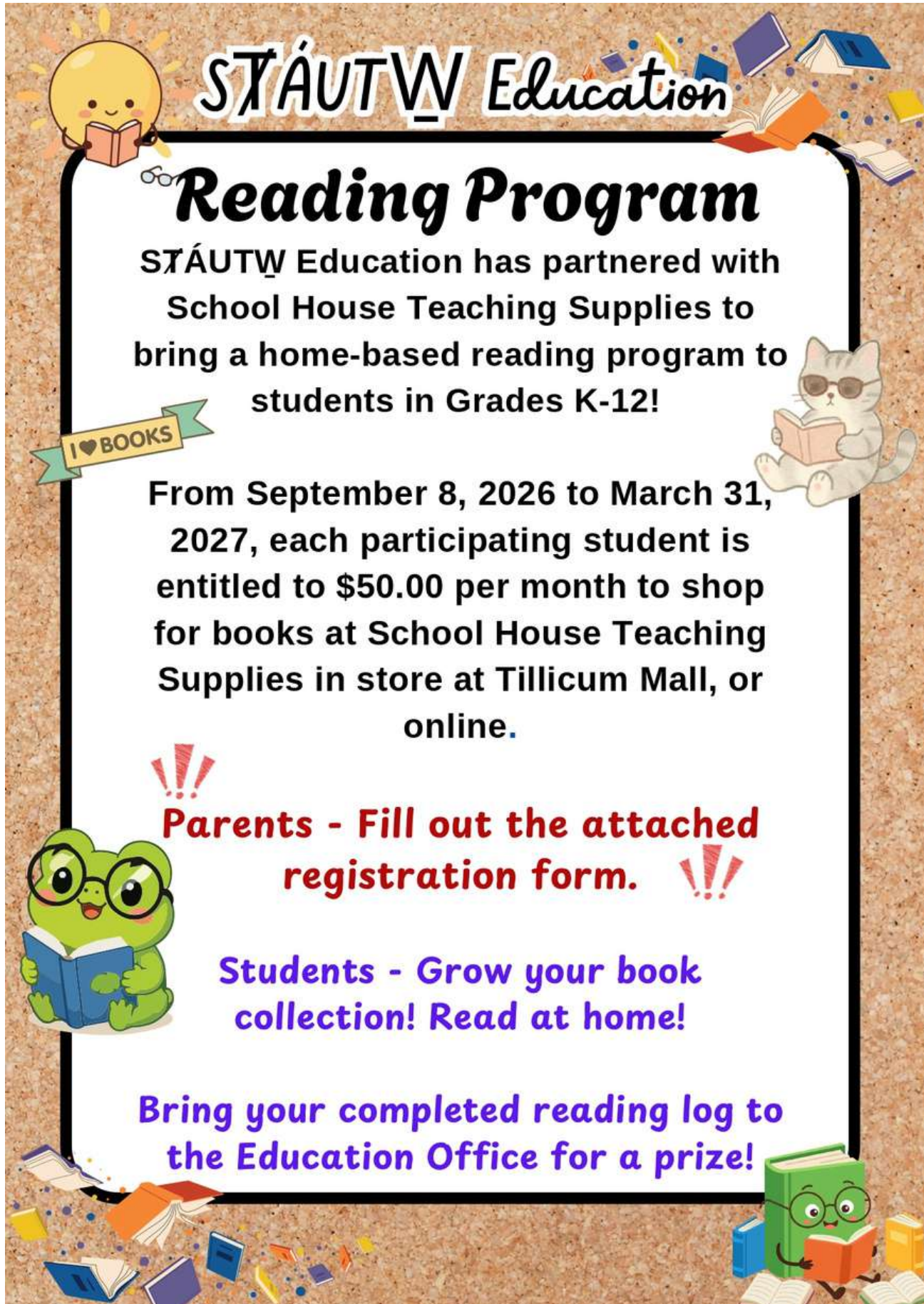

The Student Success Facilitator is responsible for implementing culturally grounded in community student success plans, learning supports, and educational programs. Reporting to the Student Success Liaison, this role provides direct support to children and youth in Grades K-12 across home, school, and community settings.

The Student Success Facilitator supports regular attendance, academic engagement, well-being, belonging, and participation in tutoring, mentoring, cultural learning, land-based learning, after-school, spring break, summer, and community-based activities. Working closely with the Student Success Liaison, Education staff, families, schools, Elders, Knowledge Keepers, language teachers, and community partners, this role helps ensure students are connected to meaningful, holistic, and culturally relevant supports that promote long-term educational success.

We are excited to share some wonderful progress at the SXEDJELI (Hummingbird) Childcare Centre going up on STÁUTW Road. The walls are going up and the windows are now being installed — the building is really taking shape, and every week brings us closer to a beautiful new space for our children.

SXEDJELI — Hummingbird Childcare Centre

Growing our little ones, close to home. · Under construction — targeted completion 2027

WHAT IT IS

A new licensed childcare centre for our community — a safe, culturally grounded place for our children to learn and grow, with our language and teachings woven into early learning.

WHAT IT MEANS

Over 90 licensed childcare spaces for families, employment in the community during and after construction, and a lasting home for early childhood programs.

CULTURE IN THE BUILD

Construction began with a groundbreaking ceremony and cedar blessing in December 2025, and a cultural monitor has been part of the work on site ever since — keeping our teachings present as the building rises.

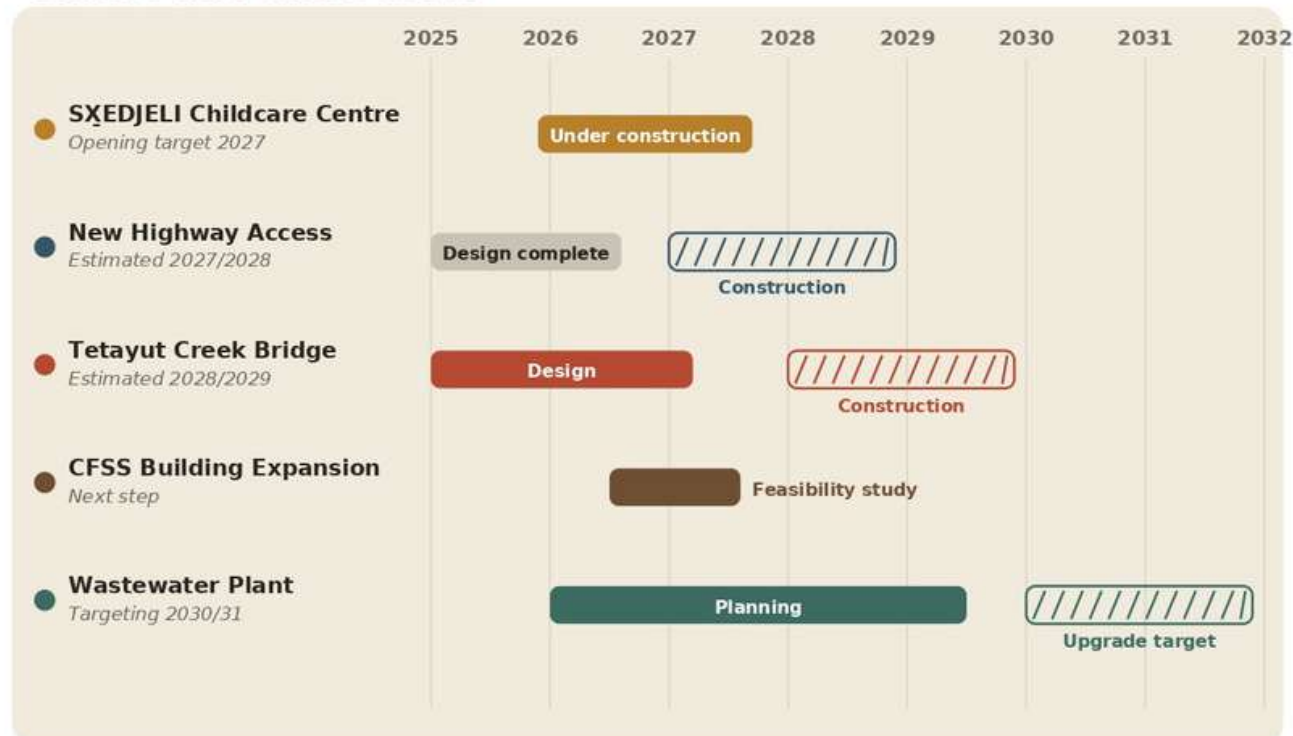

WHY THIS ORDER?

The new highway access must be built before the Tetayut Creek bridge is replaced — so the community is never cut off from Highway 17 during construction.

PLANNING AHEAD

Our Wastewater Plant

Planning the upgrade. · Feasibility complete — targeting 2030/31

The plant serves every home and building in the community, protecting our health and the waters around us.

A BIT OF HISTORY

Built by the Capital Regional District in the early 1970s on land leased from Nation members. When the CRD later consolidated its operations elsewhere on the peninsula, the plant stayed — and the Nation has operated and maintained it ever since.

WHERE WE ARE

The plant is aging and needs major renewal. A full feasibility study is complete — we know the plant's condition and what an upgrade requires. Interim repairs continue so the plant stays safe and reliable every day.

Expanding Child & Family Support Services

Room for our families. · Feasibility study next

A BUILDING WE ALL KNOW

Many members remember this building as the old band office. It has served the community for decades, with additions and renovations along the way — but it is getting older, and the programs it holds have outgrown it.

WHY MORE ROOM

A community needs assessment found staff split between buildings, programs competing for rooms daily, and — aside from the Elder's room — no dedicated space for children and youth programming.

WHAT'S NEXT — HAVE YOUR SAY

A feasibility study will turn community needs into space requirements and building options, including a possible addition and updated building systems. It includes community engagement — watch for your chance to shape these spaces.



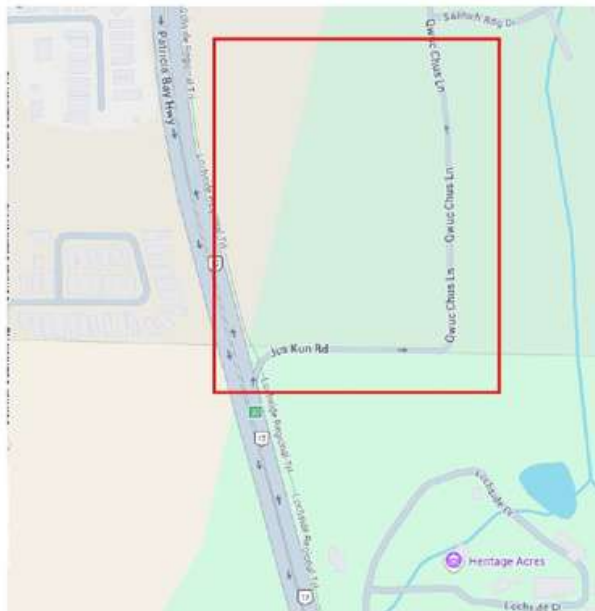

ROADS & CROSSINGS

The New Highway Access

A safe way in and out. · Design complete — estimated construction 2027/2028



Jus Kun Rd & Qwuc Chus Ln at Highway 17

A new right-in / right-out access where Jus Kun Road meets Highway 17, with upgrades to Jus Kun Road inside the community. Rooted in our Comprehensive Community Plan.

It means safer highway access, a second way in and out in an emergency, and room for the community to grow. This access is first in the sequence — it must be built before the bridge replacement can begin.

The New Tetayut Creek Bridge

You spoke. The salmon come first. · Design underway — estimated construction 2028/2029

The crossing on our primary access road has reached the end of its life. In community engagement, members and Chief and Council strongly supported a clear-span bridge — nothing in the creek channel, and the old culverts removed, so the salmon run free.

It costs more than a culvert. We chose it anyway — the community's knowledge guides this work. Construction follows the new highway access, so the community is never cut off.

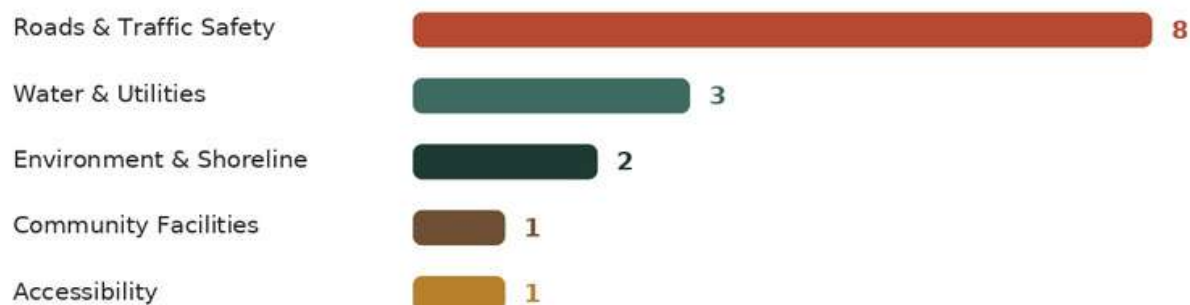
